LISTED PLACES OF WORSHIP GRANT SCHEME UPDATE

The UK-wide Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme has closed, and the replacement fund applies only in England. For many parishes and dioceses in Scotland, this means essential repairs and improvement projects for listed church buildings will become more expensive, placing further pressure on already stretched budgets. You are encouraged to write to your MSPs to ask for clarity on support in Scotland and to back a practical Scottish funding route.

The conditions of the **£20,000** legacy is that it must be spent on an accessible toilet at Comrie or it will not be paid out. Currently, David Cunningham and I are looking into it together with the Diocesan Property Manager, John O’Meara, to conduct a drainage survey to see if this is even possible, and our parish is paying for the preliminary expenses.
